No Surprises Act / Good Faith Estimate

Your Right to Receive a Good Faith Estimate

The federal **No Surprises Act** (effective Jan 1, 2022) protects patients from surprise medical bills. Under the law, healthcare providers are required to provide patients who do not have insurance or who are not using insurance with an estimate of the expected charges for medical and mental health services.

At Compass Psychological Evaluation, you have the right to receive a Good Faith Estimate that explains the anticipated cost of your psychological assessment services before care is provided.

This estimate will include reasonably expected charges for services such as clinical interviews, testing administration, scoring, interpretation, report preparation, and feedback sessions.

If you receive a bill that is at least \$400 more than your Good Faith Estimate, you have the right to dispute the bill.

You may request a Good Faith Estimate before scheduling services or at any time prior to your appointment.
